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We are so lucky to have such a great group of Junior High Students. It has been a busy month with lots of hands-on learning. Students continued doing reading buddies with younger students.

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
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


Grade 7 students have been working hard. They completed their Math unit on Patterns and Relations and were introduced to algebra. In Science, they have completed their Interactions and Ecosystems unit and are now learning about Plants. They all built a model of a flower by designing and naming their own flower. If time permits, we will pull together our learning from the first two Science units and build our own Ecosystem Models. In Social the students have been learning about European Imperialism and the effect on the Indigenous people.

GRADE 8


Students started the chemistry unit in Science. They have enjoyed completing several experiments to enhance their learning. The most recent was the "ramp test" to build their understanding of viscosity (flow of liquids). They completed their math unit on operations of Fractions and are moving into the Linear Equations and Graphing unit. Students are building Gingerbread Houses to display in the hallway. They will have to calculate the surface area and perimeter of the houses. In Social students are busy learning about Humanism and the impact of individualism in changing a society's worldview.






GRADE 9

Grade 9 students have been exceptionally busy with building their "Winter Wonderland" projects that will be on display at the Christmas Concert This project requires them to wire their own circuits to have light and movement in a Winter Village by applying their understanding of electricity. They have also done multiple experiments to test the theories they are learning in the Electricity Unit in Science. Students were busy learning about the Youth Criminal Justice Act and enjoyed participating in many different case studies. The debates and differing of ppinions was exciting and interesting to listen to.





JUNIOR HIGH

All of the Junior High students participated in an off-site activity to the South Park Cemetery to lay crosses and poppies on the graves of our local veterans. It was wonderful to see the high level of respect that students showed to the volunteers who greeted us and to the veterans as they placed the items at their graves.
