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
Principal's Message

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Once Upon A Time there were magical places where desks were aligned in neat tidy rows and children sat quietly while listening to the teacher, reading a text or writing in their notebooks. At any given time of the day everyone knew that it would be math or science or one of the other separate and unrelated topics of study. It was a truly wonderful place where everyone learned- in the same way, at the same rate while sitting still and being quiet. Parents, teachers and visitors looked and thought- "What a wonderful classroom. You can see how well the children are learning just by how neat and quiet it is."

But were they all learning? Does every child really learn in the same way and at the same speed? Research has shown that this is definitely not the case. Every child learns differently and has their own wants and needs if they are to succeed. It is the responsibility of today's *inclusive classroom* to insure that every *learner* has the opportunity, setting and resources to be successful.

Today's classrooms are therefore far removed from what many of us remember. At any given moment students may be working on several different topics or projects, using different resources/ technologies (laptops, chromebooks, cell phones, iPads, Lego or Construx kits...), in groups or individually; in the classroom, the hallway or elsewhere. If you walk past an open door it may sound quiet or quite loud, look well organized or appear to be mass confusion. Whatever the case the learners are doing their thing- learning!

The School Library as we know it is also undergoing a major change based on their need to help facilitate education in the 21st century school. The traditional image of students sitting quietly with a book while the librarian periodically reminds them to be quiet will be a thing of the past. "The Library Learning Commons is a shift in thinking from a library as a physical space that is a repository for books to an inclusive, flexible, learner-centered, physical and/or virtual space for collaboration, inquiry, imagination and play to expand and deepen learning. A learning commons is an agile and responsive learning and teaching environment available to individuals and groups to use for multiple, often simultaneous, purposes. It supports literacy, numeracy, competency development and student learning outcomes through access to and instruction in the effective use of print and digital resources." AB.
