### Budget 2021 Engagement Opportunities

Demonstrating its fiscal responsibility, the Alberta government has launched a Budget 2021 consultation process. Through an online survey, telephone town halls, and an open submission process, the government hopes to uncover Albertan's priorities about:

The online survey closes December 4, 2020, with participation details on three 6:30 to 8 p.m. telephone town hall meetings, slated for November 30, December 2 and December 3, to be announced closer to the events. Organizations also are invited to provide feedback by emailing their submissions directly to: budget.feedback@gov.ab.ca. In November, the government will bring back its 'build a budget' tool, allowing Albertans to make choices on spending and revenue, and then see the impacts their decisions have on debt and deficit. Budget 2021 will be released in February 2021.
