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Candy Gams- Valentine candy grams notices were sent out this week. Candy grams will be required to be quarantined for a minimum of 72 hours before being given to the students as per AHS regulations. A motion was made by Kim Hagman for P.A.S.S. to purchase one candy gram for each student. 80 candy grams at \$2.00 per candy gram. A total of \$160.00 to come out of the general account. The motion was seconded by Jenn Kerr. The motion passed. Local author- Bringing in the Author Sigmund Brower will be first brought to the staff to discuss first. And Email vote will be had at a later date. Science in motion- A motion was made by Sherry Pfannmuller to fund science in motion to come to each class. A cost of \$250.00 per presentation, and 5 presentations for a total of \$1250.00 out of the casino fund. The motion was seconded by Tammie Ethier, the motion passed. Guided reading books- There would be 200 different titles for teachers to choose from, 6 copies of each book for students to have their own readers to follow along. There will also be suggested lesson plans to follow. A motion was made by Debbie McRobbie to purchase guided reading books for grades K-4, in the maximum amount of \$6500.00 from Fountas and Pinnell or Scholastic Books out of the casino fund. The motion was seconded by Jenn Kerr, the motion passed. Pots and Pans/ hand mixers for foods class- A letter will be made up to ask for donations of needed items for the foods class, if all needed items are not donated a Email vote may need to be had to discuss the possibility of P.A.S.S. purchasing the needed items. Also we will need people to build the skating rink on the
