## Trustee Report:

• Current topics and highlights

Sherry Jeffreys mentioned the turnout for the most recent board meeting was so nice to see for the trustees, far too often they are left to make significant decisions regarding

the children in their districts, in this case, the public turned out to make their presentations heard on some of the more divisive subjects such as mask mandates. The option to not mandate mask-wearing in common areas and busses was defeated, and mask-wearing became mandatory. On the subject of mask mandates, the board felt it was inappropriate and unfair to leave the mask mandate up to the individual schools and was pleased when the government stepped in to regulate the wearing of masks in school common areas and busses.

As always the push to maintain the viability of Sangudo Community School is of utmost importance, keeping the doors open to facilitate the now 100+ students is paramount.

Becky Hull asked a question regarding the recent Covid-19 vaccine suggestions that were sent home. It was relayed through both Sherry Jeffreys and Sherry Pfannmuller that the suggestion is from Alberta Health Services. Northern Gateway Public Schools would not be administering the Covid-19 vaccine without parental consent. The nurses that would administer the vaccine for Sangudo Community School would come from Mayerthorpe Hospital but again would require parental consent. On Thursday, September 16th nurses from Mayerthope public health were in the school administering booster shots to the now grade 7 students that were missed last year due to Covid -19 restrictions.

Jen Shukalek asked why some families received the Covid -19 vaccine option and some families did not. Sherry Pfannmuller informed us the Covid-19 vaccine was only available to students 12 and older at this time.

Sangudo Community School staff and student body are extremely pleased to receive the 30 new students to the school this year. All new students have quickly acclimated to the new school surroundings, and the existing students at Sangudo Community School have been and continue to be truly welcoming. This has made for a seamless transition for the new students. It is a credit to the parents and teachers of our kids, for raising such kind and inclusive little people.

• Student learning goals and challenges

A grant has been put out in the wake of last years emergency transition to online learning. It was felt students may have found the platform more challenging, and their ability to adapt to online studies meant their education suffered. Thus the Covid Learning Loss Grant was created. It is unsure at this time when the funds will be made available to us.

Becky Hull indicated she has spoken to her children and they feel there is a lot of catching up to do because of the time lost due to transitioning and acclimating to the online study platform.

Mike Tavaroli and Sherry Pfannmuller both indicated that there was at present an Education Assistant in all junior high classrooms and that a Blast Program for reading was being implemented for all students

There is also a 16-week program being developed, it is in the hands of HR right now. HR is deciding who will put the program together as well as who will deliver the program to the students. The hope is the program will determine where students are academically, and where they may need help. The program is also to track the impact the pandemic has had in regards to the online learning that was implemented by AHS in response to the Covid-19 outbreak.

The information will also determine where improvements can be made, if any, in our schools and our division.

#### **Teachers Report:**

- There is lots of "buzz" about the 30 new students, the kids are excited and motivated. Volleyball has started, Shelly Reid is the coach for the girls' team and Jen Erickson is the coach for the boys' team. The first game was Wednesday, September 22, a home game against FoxCreek. Both teams did a great job. Unfortunately at this time due to Covid-19 restrictions, spectators will not be permitted. Games generally start around 4:30 and each match is around 45 minutes. The opposing coach tends to decide on the order of boys first or girls first. Staff is determining if it may be possible to live stream some of the games, especially if one or more of the teams make it to the GCAA.
