We are hoping to have a year with some out of house field trips, it is a fear that in order to gain access to some of the venues the students will have to have their Covid-19 vaccinations. For instance, an extremely popular event Hockey Hookie would require students to be vaccinated before entrance would be permitted. There are however a number of amazing in-house opportunities. The online Citadel Theatre performances, mobile escape rooms, IMAX rentals. There is also Fit Set Ninja, Mini Golf, and any other opportunities that present themselves. The space and science center in-house field trip, some felt, was not as successful and not worth the amount of money spent on the presentation.
