Highlights from the Board Meeting December 14, 2021-

Sangudo Community Delegations-two presentations were received by the Board in support of the continued operation of Sangudo Community School.

NGPS Viability Study- was presented by Superintendent Bird. The Board accepted the viability study as presented and passed a motion to continue operating the Sangudo Community School for the next three years, with the provision that Administration develop a 3-5 year plan of revitalization of the school.

NGPS Student Support Services Report-NGPS continues to build a culture of wellness to support the physical, mental, and social well-being of our students and staff. The Board received and reviewed an outline of the Division supports that are currently in place.

Highlights from Board Meeting- January 11, 2022-

Rapid Tests For Home Tests And Masks- The Government of Alberta will be supplying rapid tests for home use and masks for schools. Supplies will be distributed upon arrival.

8. New Business

- a. Water Bottles
- i. PASS would like to purchase each student a new water bottle with new logo
 Sherry Pannmuller said it would be amazing and so generous of PASS to donate water bottles to the students, but
 worried about the bottles coming back to school after students took the bottles home to be washed.
 Sherry Pannmuller informed the group, the staff tries to keep the water bottle usage down to 1 bottle per student per
 week and the students then use the refilling stations in the school.

 - b. Candy Grams Vice Chair, Jennifer Kerr

An online vote will be held for the treats we as PASS will be providing to each student and staff member, the estimated amount was \$340.00 (\$2.73 per student and staff) for treats purchased from Costco. Then purchase less expensive treats (a gummy option, Hersheys kisses, Swedish berries, or Skittles) for the students to buy for one and other, around the \$2.00 mark.

c. Pink Shirt Day - Fundraiser

Chyann Corr and 43 South Co. have designed a pink shirt for pink shirt day. It reads "In a world where you can be anything, be kind" and then has space for sponsor names.
