#### Principal's Message

Where Do We Go From Here?

As a parent or the head of a household you may have had occasion(s) to ask yourself this question. If the situation we are dealing with is to move forward it is prudent to look at where we have been, where we are now and where we need to be. This same planning process is also used by your local schools and School Division. Each year a document (Results Review) is prepared in which we examine the data that has been collected over the past year. Surveys completed by parents, students and teachers as well as Provincial exam results are all analysed for strengths and weaknesses. These results then become part of the School Improvement Plan which is our answer to: Where Do We Go From Here? As Principal I am pleased with our achievements of the past year and have great confidence in the plans for the next year. \*Both of these documents will be posted on our website shortly.

Part of any schools move forward plan is the Professional Development made available to its' staff. Currently all teachers at SCS are taking part in a series of activities called "Teaching Writing- Structure and Style" as part of our PD sessions. In addition four teachers, three Educational Assistants and several parents are taking a three day program called "JACC Training" (Joint Action for Children Committee) which has them very excited about the many new strategies they can immediately implement with their students/ children.

The School Council is also part of our moving forward plans. Last week three parents and I attended a session presented by the Alberta School Council Association and NGPS. We are all very excited about the take away ideas from this day and have a follow up meeting set to begin implementation. The key point will be to further develop the School Council role of providing advice/ ideas to the Principal on items brought forward to them.

#### **Christmas Gifts**

With Christmas rapidly approaching some parents may be wondering about gift ideas. One item you might want to consider is a chromebook. All of our students are familiar with these devices (so no learning curve) and they are relatively inexpensive (app. \$330.) when compared to a laptop. SCS does provide each student with a device to use during the day but they cannot take them home to continue their work.... Several of our students already have their own device and find it very convenient to be able to take it back and forth. They also take better care of them and make sure they are plugged in properly.

Will be held on **November 10th** at **10:45 am** in the gym. Everyone welcome to attend.


