Highlights from Board Meeting - May 10, 2022

Board Policy 10 - Policy Review and Development - The Policy Committee brought forward recommended amendments to Policy 10 (Policy Making) for Board approval. The Board affirmed the amendments presented.

Visits to Homeland and Twilight Colonies near Valleyview - On April 29, Our Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, and Secretary-Treasurer visited the Valleyview Colony schools to engage with the students and Colony leaders, and to plan for the upcoming school year. The Board values and supports the work of Division staff in providing education to our Colony students and building positive relationships with their communities.

Budget Planning for 2022-2023 School Year - Schools are in the process of planning and preparing their budgets for the upcoming school year. Budget 2022-2023 will see a 1% increase in the per pupil rate and the rural small school grants. Also, the Provincial COVID Mitigation Support which offsets the decline in student enrollments in the 2021 school year compared to projections has been continued. This means our Total Division Operating Funding will remain approximately the same for the 2022-2023 school year. We will see new Provincial surplus rules implemented next year. Operating surpluses will be capped at considerably less than our Division has previously carried forward.



Preparations for Implementation of the K-6 Curriculum - Superintendent Bird reported that dates are being set for planning and preparation sessions for staff to ensure that they feel supported and prepared for the September implementation.

ASCA (Alberta School Council Association) Virtual Conference - Trustee Petryshen attended the Conference on April 22 & 23 and highlighted some of the sessions she attended. Concerns were brought forward regarding the government's request for personal emails of the school council chairs across the province. Parents expressed concerns that the government contacting them directly is bypassing the role of ASCA & school boards. Also the gov't having access to their personal information was concerning. The \$500 grant is still accessible to school councils.

New Teacher Induction Ceremony- Trustees were pleased to be invited to attend the NGPS virtual ceremony held on May 5. Four-five Trustees attended.

Alana Simpson asked if the report from the engineers will be made available to read? Trustee Koloski informed the group when the report is received by the board it will be made available to the public. Alana SImpson relayed that Superintenant Bird had received the report, he had made that know to the group at the last revitalization committee meeting on May 10th, 2022.

Trustee Koloski said she would look into the matter further and inform the group of her findings. Alana Simpson asked Trustee Koloski to showcase Sangudo Community School and all the wonderful things that are being done at the board of Trustees meetings.

A discussion was had regarding the 'Caps on surplus funds' the Province of Alberta. The fact the Board of Trustees had planned to fund Sangudo Community School through the surplus until the year 2025, and this plan was now in jeopardy was concerning to more than one person in attendance. Sherry Pfannmuller relayed to Trustee Koloski, based on enrollment and interest from people who have moved to the community as of late, Sangudo Community School should be moving into the next funding bucket in the 2023/2024 school year. This would ensure Sangudo Community School would not be in the funding shortage we find our selves in right now. If the Board of Trustees could help us through this short time, the horrizon was looking much brighter for our little country school.

School tours are still delayed, and due to the lateness of the year there probably will not be tour done this year by the Board Of Trustees.



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This is a real shame, the school visits are one of the most anticipated events by all the trustees. The Board very much looks forward to the next school year when visits can be arranged.
