WHAT WE LEARNED

This month in Language Arts, we began our novel study of Wonder by R.J. Palacio. Throughout the study, students will explore key themes such as bullying, friendship, family, and the challenges of getting along and falling out. In addition to these important topics, students will practice skills in imagery, inferencing, and a variety of reading comprehension strategies.

We are also continuing our work with the Empowering Writers program, focusing on strengthening writing skills. Our current emphasis is on adding elaborative details to enhance the clarity and richness of students' writing.

In Math, we have completed our unit on Patterns and Equations. Next, we will be diving into multi-digit multiplication and division, where students will explore and apply a variety of strategies to solve problems.

In Science, we recently wrapped up our unit on Matter, which included a final assessment. We are now moving on to our new unit, Living Systems, where students will explore how organisms rely on vital biological processes and systems to function. This unit will help deepen their understanding of the intricate connections that support life.

In Social Studies, we are continuing our exploration of the organizing theme Time & Place. Students will delve deeper into the study of various ancient civilizations, examining how these societies developed and their impact on the world today.

THE POWER OF READING:
