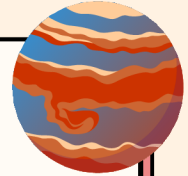




1/2 Classroom News

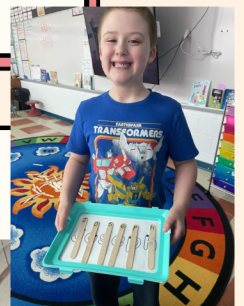

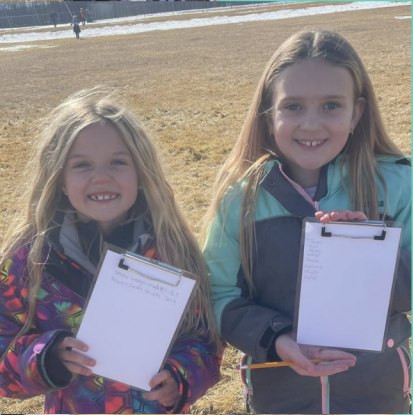

Social Studies: We are learning about the indigenous peoples of Canada.

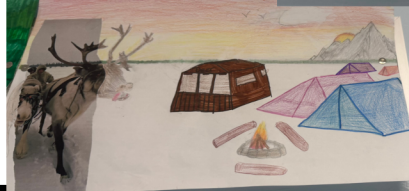
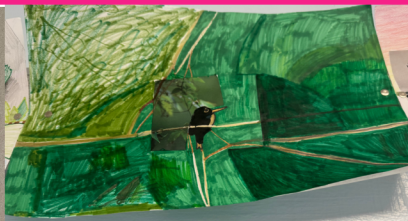
Reminders:

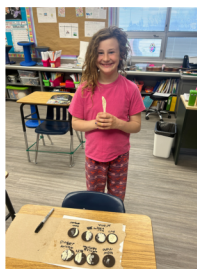
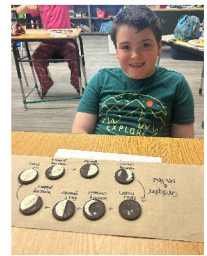
In **Math**, we have completed our work with decimals, ratios, and percentages, and are now wrapping up our algebra unit. Soon, we will be moving into graphing and probability.

Field Trip

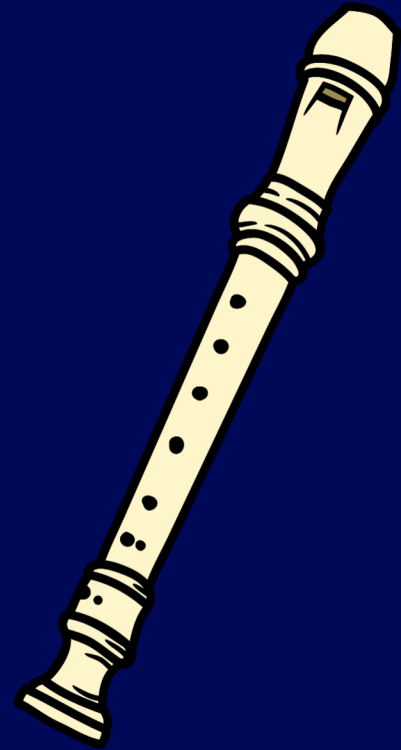
