Principal's Message

School Improvement Plan 15-16

As many of you are aware each year the principal, staff and parents of a school produce a School Improvement Plan. The is the guiding document that sets the direction for some of the staff Professional Development Sessions, plays a role in some budgeting decisions and, of course, addresses the overall community need to see our school improve with each passing year. As such the document must be shared and worked on over the year and sometimes adjustments need to be made. With the year well advanced I thought this would be a good time to share the advances we have made on the outcomes we set this year. **The entire* "School Improvement Plan" can be found on the school website.

1. Desired Outcome One: Excellence in Writing

The ability to write **well** is a skill that will be of great value throughout a person's life. Writing skills must therefore be a major focus of education. In support of this outcome our teachers have been working through a program called "Teaching Writing Structure and Style" on our PD days. I am very happy to say that I have routinely seen these strategies being employed in our classrooms during my walkthroughs and that writing is a regular part of the day at every grade level.

2. Desired Outcome Two: *Enhanced use of and access to* : *makerspace, learning commons… resources*

Sangudo Community School has an incredibly well equipped Makerspace room which is being added to on a regular basis. In addition to the hour long block at the end of the day I am now opening the room to students several noon times a week. Earlier this month some of our older students worked with the grade two class to familiarize them with the room and to teach them a little bit about making jewellery, building and programming robots, creating your own story book, and more. We used this teaching learning session to demonstrate the room and its' resources to the School Board Trustees during their annual tour. The older students enjoyed demonstrating some of the resources to the trustees and even tried getting them involved in the

3. Desired Outcome Three: **Continued opportunity to develop musical and theatrical** *interests and appreciation*

Our music program continues to grow with many active participants. In addition to the many students who focus on singing we have students playing piano, drums, guitar and bass. Thanks to the Stan Jeffreys Bursary we now have a brand new set of ukuleles which Ms. Myrol and Mrs. Vanderwolf are extremely happy with. The grade two class gave them a test run and were delighted.

4. Desired Outcome Four: a specific project sponsored by School Council focused around wellness (nutrition, active living and positive mental health)

With these factors playing such a major role in the health, well being and even the performance of our students, this outcome has taken on a life and sense of importance all of its' own. Some of the action items planned or carried out include:

- Two of our teachers, along with our trustee, attended the Shaping the Future Conference in Kananaskis this year. The teachers will be sharing information with the rest of the staff during this week's PD session,
- two others chose to attend a workshop on Power 2B Me (the new Jr. High Health curriculum) during teacher conference,

• a Yoga Instructor will attend this week's PD session to share ideas for classroom "yoga breaks" to help students reduce anxiety, regulate energy levels and improve focus and concentration, followed by a visit where she will work with individual classes

• Jr. High will be attending Empowered Me Workshops on building positive self esteem as well as attending two anti--bullying presentations at Mayerthorpe High.

Funding for most of the related expenses has come through grants secured through the efforts of our School Council members.


